
From the Directors Desk


WORLD TELEVISION DAY

The United States previously observed Armistice Day. The U.S. holiday was renamed Veterans Day in 1954.

Veterans Day is not to be confused with <u>Memorial Day</u>, a U.S. public holiday in May; Veterans Day celebrates the service of all U.S. military veterans, while Memorial Day honors those who *died* while in military service. It is also not to be confused with <u>Armed Forces Day</u>, a mino.

FRIED BANANA HAZELNUT TORTILLA RECIPE

Place the Tortilla onto a flat surface. For the banana cut some of the banana off so in can fix into the tortilla. Spread some Nutella into the middle of the Tortilla. Place the banana in the center. Fold one end to the middle part and fold left and right sides of the Tortilla
