WHITE CANE SAFETY DAY

White Cane Safety Day, on October 15th, each year, celebrates blind and visually impaired people's achievements in the United States. It reminds people of the importance of the white cane in helping the blind and the visually impaired live more independently.

In 1963, the National Federation of the Blind asked the governors from every state to proclaim October 15 of each year as White Cane Safety Day. At the time, only a few people were independent enough to travel alone on busy highways. On October 6, 1964, the U.S. Congress designated October 15 of each year as White Cane Safety Day. By 1978, the number of visually impaired people who achieved more independence through the white cane had greatly increased.

White Cane Day

Chrissy:

I use my cane to find things. I Use it to find my swing outside. I sweep from side to side. If something is in my path, the cane hits it. I've used it for as long as I can remember. I went to the Blind Center to celebrate White Cane Day. They have a party. One time I played Jeopardy at their party.

Jayann:

I was in first grade when I was trained to use cane. I was in second grade when I used a crutch. In third grade I started using a cane again. In 11th grade I started using a folding cane.



When I was young and did not have a cane, I would hold on to Mom or Dad's

hand. Or, they put me in a cart and pushed me. I use an ID cane, now, when my parents guide me. That lets people know I am blind.

Donald:

When I walk, I sweep the cane back and forth like, windshield wipers. That way I wont lose my balance. I was 11 when I went to Overbrook. That is a school for blind people. They taught me how to use a cane and get around.

CARVE A PUMPKIN DAY



Carve a Pumpkin Day is observed on October 31, 2018. Pumpkins are often carved into decorative lanterns called jack-o'-lanterns for the Halloween season in North America. This practice of carving pumpkins for Halloween originated from an Irish myth about a man name "Stingy Jack". In the United States, the carved pumpkin was first associated with the harvest season in general, long before it became an emblem of Halloween.

Parts of the pumpkin are cut out to make holes, often depicting a face, which might be either cheerful, scary, or comical. The tools used to carve and hollow out the gourd, range from simple knives and spoons to specialized instruments. Sometimes stencils are used as a guide for cutting a design into a pumpkin. When a candle is places inside and lit, the light shines out through the cut design.

Kathy – When I was young, we used to carve out a pumpkin and put a candle inside it. We carved out the eyes and made a face. My Dad helped us. He would clean out the inside so we could put a candle in it. We put it outside as a decoration.


